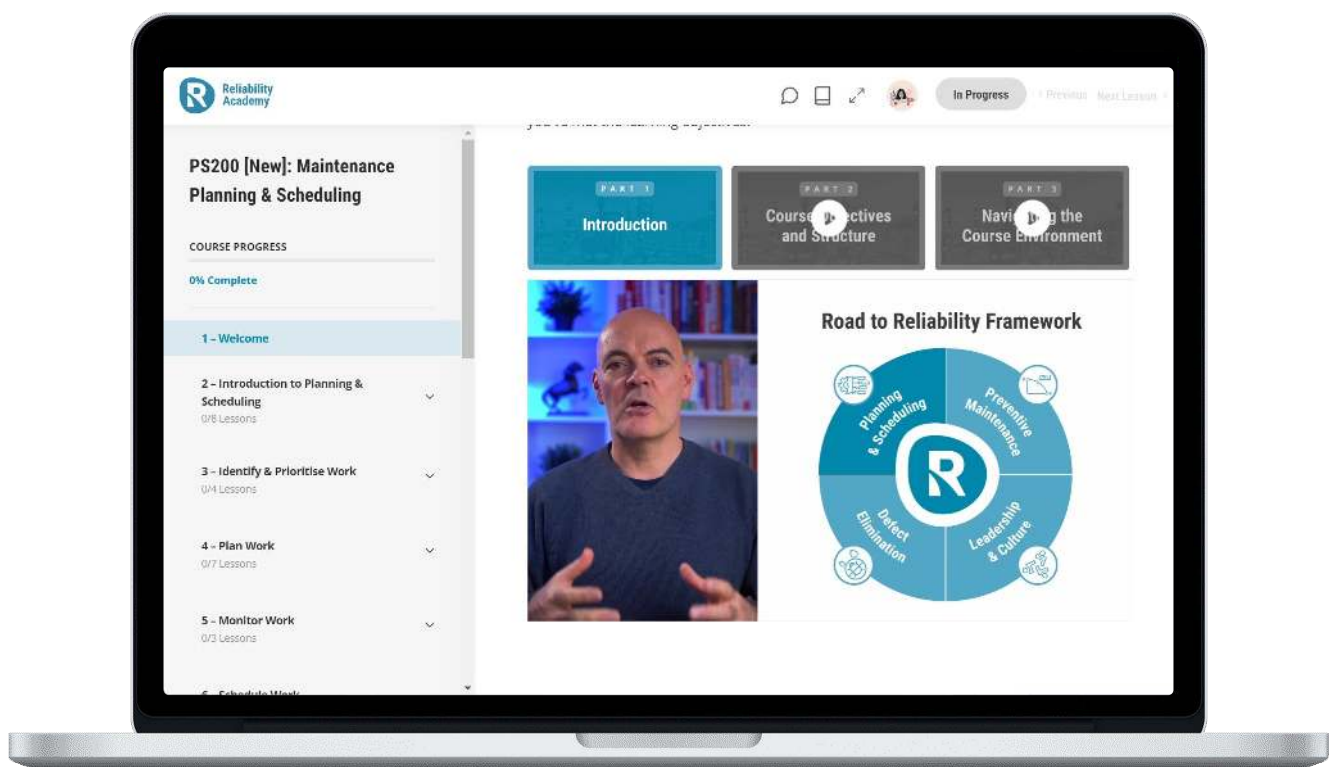

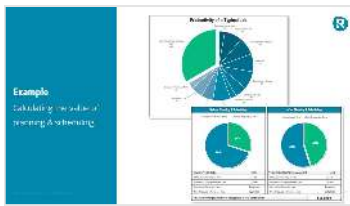

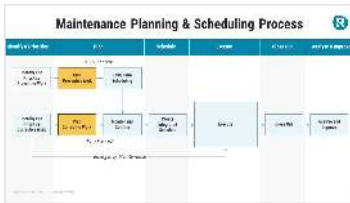

The planner also communicates the plan to the scheduler and supervisor.	Scheduler Role: The scheduler is responsible for assigning work orders to specific technicians, ensuring that the work is completed within the required time frame, and monitoring the progress of the work. The scheduler also communicates with the planner and supervisor.	Supervisor Role: The supervisor is responsible for overseeing the work, ensuring that it is completed correctly, and providing feedback to the technician. The supervisor also communicates with the planner and scheduler.

The key roles in the Planning & Scheduling Process

You will learn the roles and responsibilities of the planner, the scheduler, and the supervisor. And you will understand how each role contributes differently to an effective and efficient maintenance process.



How to objectively prioritise your work orders

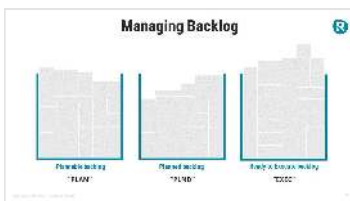
You will learn the importance of work prioritization and several, more objective methodologies. Including the Ranking Index for Maintenance Expense (RIME) priority system and using a Risk Assessment Matrix (RAM).

Dealing with Emergency Maintenance

- Once observed must be reported to Supervisor
- Conduct quick prioritization and get approval to break in to the Frozen Weekly Schedule
- Supervisor or experienced technician plans work for the day
- Do use existing records & job plans
- CMMS entry can follow later
- Don't compromise on Safety

How to deal with emergency maintenance

Learn how to deal with emergency maintenance work so that you don't lose control and slip back into a reactive work environment. Without properly handling emergency maintenance, you will find yourself dealing with high maintenance costs and poorly planned work.



How to effectively manage and reduce your backlog
